Nohoanga Site Information Sheet

WAIMA (URE) RIVER, MARLBOROUGH



Getting there

- The site is on the south bank of the Waima Ure River on the ocean side of SHW1, 10 minutes (14km) north of Kekerengu.
- On the south side of the Waima Ure River, turn off SHW 1 onto dirt track on the seaside
 of the road (approximately 8467 State Highway 1, Ward). Follow the dirt road down the
 hill to the end and turn right and continue following the track onto the site.
- The site is not signposted or marked in anyway.

Physical description

- The nohoanga is a large, open, and flat area on the south bank of the Waima Ure River.
- The site is exposed to winds (nor' westerlies and nor' easterlies) but gets plenty of sun.
- Some shelter is provided by low shrubbery and a few larger trees.

Vehicle access and parking

- Vehicle access is via a dirt/stoney road directly south of the Waima Ure River bridge.
- Access is good, although drivers are advised to drive carefully, be aware of potholes and take extra care with campervans and trailers.
- Parking is plentiful on site.



Facilities and services

- The are no facilities at the Waima (Ure) River nohoanga site. Site users need to provide their own toilet (portaloo or chemical toilet) and shower facilities.
- Nohoanga site users are required to provide their own water supplies.
- There is limited cell phone reception on this site.
- All rubbish and waste must be removed on departure. See key contacts below for details of refuse and dumping stations.



Hazards

- The land to the south of the nohoanga site is being used as a storage space for shingle and other materials for road repairs.
- Trucks use the same entry point off SHW1 to access the area. Take care when entering and exiting from SHW1 and if exploring outside the nohoanga site.

Site restrictions
