

# Hawea River, Albert Town




## **Q** Getting there

- Access is via the Lake Hawea-Albert Town Road (State Highway 6) 200m north of the bridge across the Clutha River /Mata-Au.
- The nohoanga boundaries are demarcated with waratahs. The nohoanga sign shown above sits on the nohoanga boundary.







#### **Site Information**

- The nohoanga is situated within the Albert Town Recreation Reserve. This is a public area administered by the Queenstown Lakes District Council.
- The nohoanga itself is administered by Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu during the entitlement period.
- The site is well utilised by local dog walkers. Dogs may be off the lead but must be kept under control at all times within the reserve.
- A public bike track runs through the nohoanga.
- The reserve is also used by horse riders.

#### Physical appearance

- The nohoanga is primarily flat and has some sheltered areas suitable for camping.
- It is located adjacent to the Clutha River / Mata Au and has direct access to the water.
- The vegetation covering the site is primarily exotics and weed species with some mature willows providing shade.

#### Vehicle access and parking

- The access road is unsealed, but suitable for campervans and 2wd vehicles.
- There is plenty of parking on site.

### Facilities and services

- The facilities and grounds of the campsite are very natural.
- All rubbish and waste must be removed on departure. See Key Contacts below for details of refuse and dumping stations.
- Nohoanga users must provide their own toilet facilities.
- Portaloos may be available at the adjacent campground over the summer. Nohoanga users can pay to use these portaloos at their own cost.
- There is a public bore within the adjacent campground that provides drinking water and tank for back up supply. Nohoanga users can use this bore, or alternatively bring their own drinking water.
- Albert Town Recreation Reserve is within a prohibited fire area. There is a total fire ban in the nohoanga. Users must have contained cooking facilities.
- Avoid taking vehicles off established tracks. The soils within the reserve are easily damaged by off road vehicle use.
- Cell phone reception is limited at this site.





#### **Hazards**

- The nohoanga may flood when water is released into the river from Lake Hawea. Queenstown Lakes District Council will update their website when water is to be released and the campground residents should be verbally notified.
- Some rivers, lakes or waterways may have health warnings applied to them throughout the year for toxic algae and bacteria such as benthic cyanobacteria. Regional and District Councils will have up to date information on their websites regarding any waterway health warnings in place.

# **Site restrictions**

- Occupation of the nohoanga is limited to 30 consecutive days with an authorisation from Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu.
- The use of off-road vehicles and motor bikes is prohibited, other than on formed roads within the reserve.
- Fires are not permitted.
- · Dogs must be kept under control at all times.
- By using the Albert Town nohoanga site, users are agreeing to these conditions.
