AN ACT to effect a Final Settlement of the Ngaitahu Title.
Claim. [15th December, 1944]

WHEREAS the members of the Ngaitahu Tribe and their Preamble.
descendants have from time to time made certain claims in respect of the purchase of the Ngaitahu Block by Mr. Kemp on behalf of the Crown in the year eighteen hundred and forty-eight: And whereas the persons now interested in the claims have agreed to accept the payment of the sum of three hundred thousand pounds in the manner hereinafter appearing in settlement of the aforesaid claims:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Ngaitahu Claim Short Title.

and discharging His Majesty's said Government from Ngaitahu

any claims or demands which might hereafter be made on it in respect of, or arising out of, the purchase of certain lands in the South Island belonging to the Ngaitahu Tribe (the purchase aforesaid being that referred to under the heading of "South Island Claims—Kemp's Purchase" in the report of a Native Land Claims Commission contained in paper G.-5 of the Appendices to the Journals of the House of Representatives for Session I of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one), there shall be paid to the Ngaitahu Trust Board, being the Board referred to in section sixty-five of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, without further appropriation than this Act, in each year for a period of thirty years and no longer, the annual sum of ten thousand pounds, payable on the first day of April in each year, commencing with the first payment on the passing of this Act as for the first day of April in the year nineteen hundred and forty-four.
